Message from the Pastor

As the May newsletter deadline rolled around, I realized I was not only still recovering from my recent surgery, but I was also trying to catch up on contacts and work that had been postponed during this time of convalescence. So, I've decided to share a meditation with you that I wrote in 2009. At that time, I was asked to be a contributing writer for The Upper Room's 2010 Disciplines daily devotional book. This is the conclusion of a week-long series of meditations I wrote based on the Common Lectionary scripture selections for one week of that year. The meditation begins with the scripture reference to set up the reflection that is then followed by a short prayer. I suggest you read the scripture reference before reading the meditation that follows. I hope it will be a blessing to you. I am grateful for God's steadfast love that continually calls us to grow in love, faith, and service.

Please read Psalm 66: 1-12

Being a neighbor means we have a responsibility to one another. It means showing respect to each other and helping one another. Generally, when we talk of being a neighbor, we are referring to those people who live near us. However, the biblical notion of neighbor is much broader. It requires that we recognize our global obligation to be neighbors. Yet too often we ignore our responsibilities to others. Our concern should include those who live near us as well as those who live across the ocean. If we consider all those who live near us as neighbors and those who live in other countries as our neighbors, then we are responsible for taking care of all the world's people. According to the Psalm, suffering is universal. We suffer when we lose jobs, when loved ones die, and when we are debilitated by disease and poor health. Life is full of suffering, and we often feel alone and in exile. But God dwells amongst us. By recognizing God's presence and God's promises, our perspective changes from despair to hope and then to gratitude---because in God, we gain insight, wisdom and peace.



Administrative Council Minutes - April 13, 2021

Jimmy Neeley, Council Chair, called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m. Jimmy Neeley opened with a prayer. In attendance: Pastor Dave Moreno, Bill Law, Melissa Law, Tony Barber, Wanda Johnson, Craig Glasscock, Erwin Janszen, Leland Singer and Ken Johnson.

Included in the Council packet: Agenda, Balance Sheet, Monthly Profit and Loss and Profit and Loss Budget Performance. This meeting was held through Zoom in order to continue social separation due to the Coronavirus.

Minutes from the previous meeting on March 9, 2021 were approved. Motion made by Wanda Johnson. Second by Tony Barber. All in favor.

Financial Reports were provided and explained by Wanda Johnson.

- 1. I decided not to send any apportionments to the Rio Texas Conference for March. We did end up with another loss for the month of March \$146.59.
- 2. We received an email from GoGriddy stating that they had filed for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy. That is the only information we have at this time.
- 3. We deposited our SBA PPP Loan amount of \$6,014.57 on April 1. Because we are a 501c Non-Profit we were not eligible for all of our salary expenses. The First National Bank of Victoria that handled our loan encouraged us to spend these funds on salary expenses only.

Trustees Report - Craig Glasscock reported he got bids on the electrical work that needed to be done. Terry Mosier bid \$16,000.00. Hasderff Lee bid \$17,000.00. Mr. Lee said the wires from Weimer Hall needed to be buried. Mr. Glasscock said he did high quality work. American Electric bid \$15,000.00 but his bid was not specific on what he would be doing. Erwin Janszen thanked him for all his work on getting these bids.

Pastor Dave provided an oral **Pastor's report** – Monday is his only day off and he requested unless it's an emergency to contact him the next day. Light switch on the pulpit is broken and the light in the women's restroom is out. Tony Barber said he would get them fixed. He needs someone to come and remove weeds at the parsonage. He bought weed and feed and will put it out. We will revisit next month on wearing masks and social distancing. DeeDee Stork plans on reopening the children's class room in June. The next meeting will be at Weimer Hall. For anyone not comfortable attending, it will also be on Zoom. It's okay not to attend.
