First United Methodist Church Palacios MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

On Sunday, May 23rd, we celebrated Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples in Jerusalem and the birth of the Christian church. The arrival of the Spirit enables us to grow into a deep profoundly personal relationship with God and one another. It teaches us to love and serve and learn. In my sermon, I shared that we as a church need to be in prayer for our denomination as it moves towards separation into at least two different Methodist organizations. I mentioned that the leaders of the United Methodist Church are probably going to vote to accept a plan called the Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation. (There is a link below if you want to read more about it.) The vote will take place during General Conference, Aug. 29 - Sept. 6, 2022, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. In preparation, the group representing traditionalists, have organized and put forth the structure for a new Methodist denomination named the Global Methodist Church (GMC). Although the Protocol was released in January of 2020, the plans for the creation of the GMC were only developed in the last few months. Timelines for implementing this separation have been put on hold because of the pandemic. Still, at some point in the future, as I mentioned in my sermon, FUMC Palacios will have to make a choice about the affiliation of this congregation. Will it remain with the United Methodist Church, or will it choose to join the Global Methodist Church?

The link below has details and information if you are interested in learning more about the *Protocol*. If and when it is approved, this congregation will eventually gather and vote. The decision will determine this church's denominational affiliation. The property will continue belong to the congregation. The process of choosing affiliation may be a lengthy one, potentially drawn out over two or more years. So, what does all this have to do with Pentecost? I believe that we need to be in very intentional prayer for our church, our denomination, and for one another. I also believe that during this time the presence, wisdom, and love of the Holy Spirit in our lives is essential for a holy transition. Our United Methodist Church exists because of separations and unifications that occurred over the 200 plus years since it began. The Christian community our founder, John Wesley, brought to the Americas is not the church

that exists today. Worldwide there are at least 80 different Methodist denominations in existence; at least three different ones in the US already. For many of us this may be an emotional and difficult process. As we deliberate, let us do so with a heart of love. Let us seek to do this with the guidance and love of God, respecting one another, and seeking God's will for our lives and our church. Our work as a witness for Christ will never end. Let us work together as the body of Christ in service to our world and one another throughout this transition and in the days beyond.

Please join me in this prayer. Lord, we are not good at waiting for anything. We want to know what to do right now, right here. We want the plan all laid out for us so that we can project the end results. Help us place our total trust in your abiding love and presence. Give us patience and persistence in our ministries and mission. Give us courage to accept your love and strength to witness to your love in all that we do. In Jesus' Name, we pray. AMEN.

Walking With God – Walking Group

There is a Run for God kit and books that can be purchased at runforgod.com. I have some in my office that I can share. It is broken up into a 12 week program, but again, we modified it and extended it to become an ongoing walking program. Each day we meet, we talk about a devotional or bible verse as we walk with a goal to either further our distance or add a health challenge to our walk. Program can be done individually or in a group. The Wesley Nurse can monitor progress by helping with goal setting, monitoring weight and BMI, and give bible verses and/or devotionals to guide your walk.

FUMC'S electrical system for the church is in dire need of repair work. Much of it has to be replaced. Decades ago it was installed and it requires a great deal of work. New wiring needs to be run to Weimer Hall. The electrical feeds from the power lines to the church need to be replaced. New outside cutoffs and breakers are needed. A new power pole must be installed. We have begun a fundraising project to raise the \$15,000 to \$16,000 necessary to take care of this important issue. We are on the way. Let's keep going and reach our goal, hopefully, before summer's end.


Mission and Outreach Corner

Included in the Council packet: Agenda, Balance Sheet, Monthly Profit and Loss and Profit and Loss Budget Performance.

This meeting was held through Zoom in order to continue social separation due to the Coronavirus.

Minutes from the previous meeting on April 13, 2021 were approved. Motion made by Tony Barber. Second by Wanda Johnson. All in favor.

Pastor Dave provided an **Oral Pastor's report** -The dishwasher at the parsonage falls forward when you open it and it needs to be secured. After this last rain, everything in the sanctuary was dry, so there is no leak in the roof. Still looking for an internet service. Pastor Dave will be teaching Sunday school to the Junior High and High School children beginning July 11, 2021.

Financial Reports were provided and explained by Wanda Johnson.

- 3. I have re-applied for a credit card for Pastor Dave, since he cancelled his last credit card in order to stop the excessive charges by Griddy.com.

DeeDee Stork reported - Young Adult/Youth Group - Will be introducing a new program to start on Sunday, July 11th at 5:00 p.m. for Young Adults (18 years and up) and Youth (Junior High and High School students). The program will consist of a meal, a short devotional and fellowship. Childcare will be provided, so bring your children and a friend or two. This group will meet on Sunday evenings twice a month from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00p.m.. We are looking for someone to oversee the youth and guide them during their devotional time. We are also looking for people to help with meals and childcare.
